When the V-flume was first introduced into the foothills and mountains in northeastern California, it revolutionized the local lumber industry. Transportation of timber from higher to lower elevations no longer had to be done with plodding beasts pulling heavy wagons weighted down with stacks of lumber over rutty, bumpy old roads.
