



The story includes discussion of the impact on Native Americans in the area and interaction with the large Chinese population nearby.

The Research Corner by Nancy Brower

Grants from the California Revealed program of the State Library have assisted BCHS in cataloging and digitizing collections within our archives. Our first grant, about five years ago, digitized the Moak Collection of Las Plumas power plant images and Bill Talbitzer's visual history of the construction of Oroville Dam. These items plus more (including some audio recordings) are available to the public on the Internet Archives at archive.org. More recently, a cataloging grant enabled the archives volunteers to accession photos from the Boynton Collection and the Butte County Farm Bureau. (Seth and Kate Boynton owned the Oroville Register and were long time early residents of Oroville.)

Currently, BCHS is fortunate to be participating in two grant projects. The first involves the digitization of three scrapbook collections. These include material from the Veterans of World War I organization. the Butte County Farm Bureau, and a compilation of material on the Parlin family (early Oroville residents.) The WWI material is of particular interest to those who had Butte County ancestors who participated in that conflict. The second grant is another cataloging opportunity to facilitate the organization and description of material produced by Bill Talbitzer during his career as a newspaperman and writer. It includes manuscripts and photographs. Much of the grant funding is used to purchase acid free storage materials to help preserve these historical treasures.
