Wildflower season on Table Mountain is in full bloom and the Oregon City School House is buzzing with activity. Our wildflower weekends got off to a wet start in early March but a little sunshine brings folks around and we have been busy! As we go to print with this issue of *Slickens*, we are about half way through our scheduled openings for this season and nearly two hundred people have toured our little school house and surrounding grounds.

Now is a good time to visit and enjoy the green foot hills and blooming flowers. To get there from Table Mountain Boulevard in Oroville, take Cherokee Road up to the North Table Mountain Ecological Reserve parking lot. From there, follow the signs to the Oregon City Covered Bridge Once you cross the bridge the School House can be seen just up the road.

If you want to avoid the traffic at the parking lot, or if you are coming from Chico, take Highway 70 to the Cherokee Road turn off and again, follow the signs to the covered bridge.

The School House will be open for tours on weekends through April 23. Our hours are 11 am to 3 pm.
